CALL TO ACTION - JUBILEE NATURE PARK **VOLUNTEERS.** A dramatic transformation has taken place in the Jubilee Nature Park this year, starting with the clearance of scrub, ash saplings and brambles. This is thanks to the hard work and funding by volunteers, and the Diocese who funded the concrete paths and rough grading of the soil in preparation for seed sowing. The seed mix will be a mixture of short native fescue grasses suitable for summer drought and short growth and mixed with short wildflowers such as daisies, selfheal, white clover and birds foot trefoil. In the central area they will be mown lightly to form a flowering lawn – perfect for picnics. The outer margins of the area will be sown with taller biennials and perennials such as foxgloves, red campion, buttercups, greater willowherb and teasels. The spaces between the benches will be planted with perennial herbs for all to use. The fruit trees are flourishing, thanks to the dedication of Lynn Orchard and helpers watering them regularly. We hope the park will be a sustainable place for both wildlife and people to thrive. We need more volunteers for the next step. Now the weather is cooler, we would like you to join the Saturday work parties with rakes, forks, secateurs and wheelbarrows to break up the clods, rake out the stones, cut off exposed tree roots and level the ground in preparation for seed sowing. We also need donations of native and naturalistic bulbs and plants such as snowdrops, crocuses, daffodils, bluebells, cowslips and primroses and herbs such as chives, oregano, thyme and rosemary. COVID VACCINATION MARSHAL

VOLUNTEERS. In September the next phase of COVID vaccinations will start and is expected to run through to the end of December 2022. As in previous programmes, the Martock surgery will act as a vaccination hub for our four local area practices. It will also provide support to the national booking system. It is anticipated the hub will be operating 09:00-13:00 and 14:00-18:00 three days a week on Thursdays. Fridays and Saturdays, with patients being called to appointments in these times. To support the practice and other health staff undertaking the vaccinations, volunteer marshals are being sought. The marshals provide support for car parking, wheelchair assistance, and direction to patients etc in 2 hour slots when they are available and are provided with yellow jackets, and full briefings.
