Parish Council managed to have a very successful monthly meeting at the beginning of October.

Planning: There were no planning applications to discuss in October.

Resignation of Stuart Maunder: The Parish Council received the resignation of Stuart Maunder towards the end of September. Stuart has been a Parish Councillor for Norton for many years and the Parish Council wish to thank him for all his hard work over the years.

The Parish Council is currently working with our Monitoring Officer to follow the correct procedure with regards to advertising the vacancy. If there is anyone who fancies becoming a Parish Councillor then please do get in touch with the Clerk to find out more about the role. nortonpcclerk@outook.com Norton sub Hamdon Parish Council meets on the second Monday of every month except August.

You can become a councillor as long as you are: British or a citizen of the Commonwealth or European Union. At least 18 years old. Registered to vote in the area or have lived, worked or owned property there for at least 12 months before an election. You can't be a councillor if you: work for the council you want to be a councillor for, or for another local authority in a political restricted post; are the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order or interim order; have been sentenced to prison for three months or more (including suspended sentences) during the five years before election day; have been convicted of a corrupt or illegal practice by an election court.

If you are in any doubt about whether you are eligible to stand as a councillor, you should contact the electoral services department at your local council for advice. The next Parish Council meeting will take place on **Monday 14**th_**November 2022 starting at 7.30pm**. Members of the general public are more than welcome to attend. YEOVIL BUS USERS GROUP My name is Linda. I am the lead for Yeovil Bus Users Group and part of Somerset Bus partnership, meaning I invest my time in protecting and improving bus services in and around Yeovil and Somerset, I'm in contact with County Councillors and transport companies alike to address situations and the focus is very much passenger led. I have been the voice for people like you! Regarding our bus services at present, the government has been supporting them with the DFT Bus recovery fund, which has kept several of our services running throughout the covid epidemic. However it is becoming evident that after March 2023, this money will be withdrawn! At present buses in the county have not recovered to passenger numbers pre-covid, and are running about 60%, whilst other counties numbers have increased faster. So now is the time to make our mark. Already there has been an improvement with increased numbers on some routes which is positive news, but this trend needs to continue so that we can keep our buses going and that will be with your help. Increased usage is the strongest way to keep our services running in March 2023 and beyond. Buses support the local economy, the environment, the health and well being of many residents, and are lifelines for others. They are important for the social interaction and connectivity which was cruelly taken away by covid. This is why I am appealing for people who would be interested in becoming bus champions people who realise the importance of public transport and are willing to discuss/ spread the word about buses. Plus be willing to put up information and posters in local areas, and regularly check timetables, making sure they are up to date.

People in the surrounding rural areas are often missed out and the Somerset partnership and I realise that these services are as important if not more so, and I hope that with your help we can increase information understanding and passenger usage. If you would like
