PARISH COUNCIL REPORT JANUARY 2023

The Parish Council managed to have a very successful monthly meeting at the beginning of January.

Planning: There were no planning applications to discuss in January.

New Dates for PC Meetings for April and May: Due to both the April and May meetings falling on bank holidays, it was agreed that the dates for both meetings will change: April's meeting was due to fall on Easter Monday (10th April). The Parish Council agreed unanimously that the April meeting should be brought forward a week to accommodate for the Bank Holiday. **To confirm, the April meeting will be held on MONDAY 3**rd

APRIL 2023. The Clerk also pointed out that the May Parish Council meeting was also due to fall on the May Bank Holiday (8th May – date for the Coronation Bank Holiday). However, the Monday before also fell on a bank holiday (1st May – Spring Bank Holiday). **Therefore, the Parish Council unanimously agreed that the May PC meeting would held on the TUESDAY 9th MAY.**

Signs for gate and Jubilee Garden: The Parish Council agreed to pay for a 'push' and 'pull' sign to go on the new wrought-iron gate on the footpath by the church as it was pointed out that it was not clear this was a gate. A sign has also been commissioned to go on the footpath signpost on New Road that will point people to the Jubilee Garden. The next Parish Council meeting will take place on **MONDAY** 13th FEBRUARY 2023 starting at 7.30pm. Members of the general public are more than welcome to attend. REFUGEE AID FROM TAUNTON 2023 RAFT

continues to request donations to send to those living in refugee camps and, if necessary, for those resettled in the Taunton area. They also help homeless people in need. Some refugees now volunteer with the charity, sorting and packing donated goods. Raft requests blankets, sleeping bags, tents, but no other bedding is wanted at present. Suitable, clean, washable clothing for men (not large sizes please), women, children and babies, plus hygiene items for all are always needed. Refugee Support Group receives your donations and, if necessary, will collect, and transports them to Raft. In addition, trustees at Raft have set up an ebay page where they are now selling individual clothing and footwear not suitable for life in camps. They need to be in good condition and would include those designated 'vintage'. Many, I expect, would be unwanted purchases or presents, and are sometimes even from businesses closing down. Raft uses the money to buy baby and hygiene products. They are also now having to find £18,000 a year for smaller premises where previously they were fortunate to have, from the council for free, a large premises awaiting redevelopment.
