have had to find a new printer due to our last lady printer retiring after many years of excellent and reliable service. Her prices were very reasonable but, as is to be expected, our printing costs have now gone up owing in part to the rise in cost of paper and. although newsletter funds are in a good place at present, we need to be mindful of the future. Until now the newsletter was just about funded by adverts and donations and by the shop allowing us to have the money from the Shop notice board, but with the increased costs this will not be enough in the future. Whilst we will be looking at how to address this, in the meantime if you are visiting the village shop please could you consider putting any spare change or a small donation in the green newsletter box on the post office counter - it would be much appreciated. NORTON SHOP & POST OFFICE Thank you very much to all of our customers. You have donated more than £600 to the counter collection box to assist with energy costs. We have made it a priority to reduce our overheads; we have drastically reduced our energy consumption and are continuing to examine every outgoing cost, such as waste disposal, insurance, and broadband. We are also inspecting every stock item and replacing those that are taking too long to move off the shelves. Keep an eye out for specials and clearance sales.

We can save a lot of money if we can get a Vax or similar spot-wet carpet cleaner. If you have one sitting around collecting dust, please upcycle it and bring it to the shop or we can collect it.

Increased foot traffic and popular Bagnell Farm produce are increasing our revenue. For the next three months, we will be testing new product lines. The addition of gifts and the expansion of our pet line to include accessories such as toys, collars, and leads are currently being considered. In addition, we are gathering cost and viability data in order to investigate outside vending machines.

Find out what the Post Office has to offer for travel money cards, cash, insurance, bill payment, mobile top-up, package collection for Amazon Prime, and regular banking. Join our team of volunteers in the shop, keep up with all the village news and meet lots of customers. You can work any shift you want, from an hour to a half day. NORTON PARISH COUNCIL REPORT MARCH 2023

The Parish Council managed to have a very successful monthly meeting at the beginning of March. **Planning:** There were no planning applications to discuss this month.

The End of an Era: This was the last meeting that Cllr Hewitson attended as our District Councillor. From the 1st April SSDC will be abolished and Somerset will be under a Unitary Council. Cllr Hewitson will now become our Unitary Councillor alongside Cllr. Patrick. The Parish Council thanked Cllr Hewitson for the support that the South Somerset District Council have given the Parish Council and the village over the years. There have been many large projects that have taken place within the village that have only been possible with their support and we are extremely grateful.

Household Support Fund: The Somerset Household Support Fund is funded by the Department for Work and Pensions and administered by Somerset County Council.

The fund is designed to provide short-term financial support to vulnerable households which are struggling

to afford household essentials this winter. These households will need help with the cost of food. energy, water bills and other essentials. To be eligible: You must live in the county of Somerset. You will be over the age of 16 and living independently of parents or carers. You are struggling to pay for essentials because you don't have enough money to pay for them. You can provide the required proof of your identity, Somerset residency and proof of your income (the most recent, last month's, bank statement) The website form is available 24 hours a day, and by using this to make your application you will help us manage the scheme effectively. SPRING... INTO SUMMER. Now in March much of Britain is covered in snow and temperatures are very low everywhere. But small signs of spring are also everywhere and summer will eventually follow. As it is for us, so for Southern Europe and for the Middle East where night temperatures can be freezing. In preparation, Raft (Refugee Aid from Taunton) is requesting, from those who are able to give, lightweight clean washable clothing for men (not extra large, please), women, children and babies and suitable footwear for all; unopened hygiene products for all are very necessary. Raft has also been specifically asked for crutches, folding wheelchairs and new off-the-shelf medication. When I recently visited Raft's warehouse a huge number of boxes of medical supplies, mainly funded by trustees selling new items online, but some by supporter fundraising, were waiting to be collected and transported.
