Our first planned talk will welcome back Monty Halls in July. Many of you will know Monty Halls from his greatly enjoyed talk in January 2022. A Nortonian in his youth, Monty is a broadcaster, marine biologist, author (including his latest book Commando accompanying the BBC series) and has circumnavigated the world 3 times in his travels to some of the most remote

environments on earth. Do watch out for the date of his talk and further details of his presentation that will be promulgated in the next edition, out in early July and on Notice Boards around the village.

In September David Harrison, a local historian with particular interests in the age of the Anglo Saxons, has kindly agreed to provide our Pulman Talk in the church. #### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT FOR MAY 2023.

The Parish Council managed to have a very successful monthly meeting at the beginning of May.

Planning: There were no planning applications to discuss this month. Annual Meeting: The Parish Council's Annual Meeting took place before the May monthly meeting. The election of officers and representatives took place. Councillor More was made Chairman for another year. In the Chairman's report, Cllr More talked about the formation of the Unitary Council for Somerset now called The Somerset Council. She discussed how pleased we are to still have Mike Hewitson as one of our Unitary Councillors for the village as he continues to do such an excellent job in representing the village. She also reported on the budget restrictions being very tight for this financial year. The Parish Council are still waiting to be informed by Somerset Council what 'extras' the Parish Council will be expected to pay for in addition to their normal commitment. Due to this, like all Parish Councils in Somerset, we unfortunately had to raise the precept to mitigate any future demands on our budget. She spoke about the completion of the fabulous renovation of the play area on the recreation ground which appears to be very popular with not only the children in our village, but also children using the village hall for other events. Also in the last financial year, the Parish Council restored the wrought-iron kissing gate, railings and pedestrian gate by the Jubilee Garden on the church footpath. This project was completed by Steve Collier, who did an incredible job. Cllr More mentioned the unfortunate departure of two of our Councillors in 2022. Stuart Maunder felt his position was untenable due to events regarding the village shop and Rachel Cumberbatch resigned due to family reasons. We are very pleased to say that we had more applications to become Councillors than we had vacancies for and are delighted to welcome Peter Gartrell and Jennie Harris to the Council. The Parish Council continue to support Hamdon Youth Group with their youth worker and were able to financially support the village shop and the Reading Room via section 137 payments. The boules court received a grant from the PC as well. This new facility for the village is in regular use and is proving very popular.

Thanks must also go to Matt Orchard and Austin Harding for their continued hard work around the village. Finally, a huge 'Thank You' to all the Parish Councillors who give up their time voluntarily. Councillors are often stopped when going about their normal daily lives to discuss village matters and do so willingly and with good grace. The Parish Council has representatives on several village committees including the CLT and the Reading Room, all of which are time-consuming but form an important part of village life.

The next meeting will be held on **Monday** 12<sup>th</sup> June 2023 at 7.30pm in the committee room in the village hall. Members of the general public are more than welcome to attend.
