Unfortunately the printing costs have tripled this year and as treasurer I would like to be pro-active in reminding everyone that we are currently running at a loss which cannot be sustained for much longer.

AGM We are pleased that our sales data have continued to indicate a higher trend compared to the same time last year as we approach the one-year anniversary of the shop's threatened closure. Also approaching is the CLT's annual general meeting that will take place in October, open to all members who will be eligible to vote. YOUR HELP IS NEEDED REFUGEE SUPPORT GROUP (RSG) The very successful event in June, Music in the Meadow, raised almost £1500 for two refugee charities. It was our sixth Music in the Meadow as well as other events over the years, and will likely be our last as we are struggling to find committee members. While we are continuing to collect and receive donations for Raft, fundraising will be out of the question unless there are other volunteers willing to commit to the group. Thus, your help is very much needed. Raft (refugeeaidfromtaunton) after eight years continues to request donations to send to refugee camps overseas, with some for refugees settling in Taunton; some of the latter are now volunteering at the charity. Raft can be found on Facebook showing immediate needs. During September donations of summer clothing and footwear will still be accepted. From October we are seeking clean warm washable clothing and suitable footwear for all - from babies to older people. Unopened hygiene products, toiletries and off the shelf medication for every group are always in short supply, plus new underclothing. At present prams, buggies and travel costs are needed too. Refugees from wars and from natural and climate disasters are constantly increasing and it seems an insurmountable issue. US President Theodore Roosevelt once said.
