## PARISH COUNCIL REPORT SEPTEMBER 2023

The Parish Council managed to have a successful monthly meeting at the beginning of September following our August break.

CIIr. Prue Biddle: The Chairman expressed the Parish Council's deep shock and immense sadness at the passing of fellow Parish Councillor and dear friend Cllr. Prue Biddle. The following statement was read out by the Chair. 'No-one could have imagined that as we left the last PC meeting, we would be mourning the loss of our dear friend and valued parish councillor Prue Biddle. Prue was our longest serving parish councillor and had at one time been the chair of the PC - a role she had occupied for 8 years. Prue was a huge friend to Norton and had involved herself in many projects throughout the village. She was instrumental in fund raising for the school and the village hall and was a great supporter of the village shop both as a volunteer and a customer. Prue was a champion for those in society who needed some support. It was Prue who last winter invited members of the community into her home so those less fortunate than herself had somewhere warm to spend a few hours. Prue donated her time and expertise to being the PC representative for Hamdon Youth Group and was delighted when we saw an improvement in anti-social behaviour in the village. There was a steely core to Prue – she would stand up to those who she thought were in the wrong and often delighted in having the last word whether that was at the PC meetings or by challenging other members of society including our local politicians. No-one is irreplaceable but it's a

close-run thing with Prue. Her wicked sense of humour, her knowledge of the village and her worldly wisdom will be sorely missed. Our deepest condolences go to Moish and Rachel and to her grandson whom she doted on. RIP Prue. We will miss you.'

**Planning:** There was one planning application to discuss this month. Location: Foxhollow Farm Little Norton. Proposal: Single Storey Extension Number: 23/02087/HOU. The Parish Council had no objections to this application.

Somerset Council is warning that it will have to draw on reserves for the second successive year to fund the rising cost of both Adult and Children's social care. The Council's financial position has been described as "stark and challenging". The warning comes as other councils in the UK are raising concerns that their budgets are unsustainable. The papers reveal that the Council drew £18 million from reserves last year to fund spending beyond the 2022/23 budgets in Adult and Children's care services. The Council has a legal obligation to fund these services, which have seen an unprecedented rise in both overall demand and complexity of need since the Covid-19 pandemic. These two social care services are currently projected to overspend by £21 million again in the current financial year. This is despite significant increases in budgets in the two previous years. Other challenges faced by the new unitary Council include the rising cost of processing an increasing amount of household waste and the cost of refinancing loans taken out by five predecessor councils. The current and next two years will be particularly challenging until the benefits of transformation of services at the new Council can be realised.

Parish Council Vacancy: We now have to recruit for a Parish Councillor following the very sad passing of Prue Biddle. The Parish Council is currently working with our Monitoring Officer to follow the correct procedure with regards to advertising the vacancy. If there is anyone who fancies becoming a Parish Councillor, and would like to put themselves forward for consideration, then please do get in touch with the Clerk to find out more about the role and the procedure to apply. nortonpcclerk@outook.com.
