Chairman's report for year ended 2023 The

Flower Show year started with the plant sale in May. There were lots of interesting stalls and the beautiful weather drew in a large crowd. We made the impressive sum of £983. The committee worked tirelessly to organise both events. Due to the high costs attributed to having two marquees last year we scaled back to one marguee to make savings to be able to fund a similar level of entertainers as last year. The show started with a spectacular seven foot puppet leading a fantastic samba band "collecting" supporters on their way from the Lord Nelson to the show. The aim of the show was to build on the success of last year which worked well as noted by yet another record gate receipts and a very health tea refreshment total. A special thanks must go to the Ladies Group for their sterling efforts, both at the Flower Show and at the Plant Sale and to all the growers for the plant sale. The show desperately needs support and in particular new committee members to bring new ideas to develop the show and take it to the next level. It is to be hoped that people will come forward for these roles. A list of these posts was made available in the meeting. A special thanks also to our Patrons and their financial contributions to our funds. The show costs a lot to stage and we are going to have to look at extra fundraising next year if the show is to continue in its present format. After all costs and income are taken into account the show made a loss of just over £897.25.
