## **PARISH COUNCIL REPORT JANUARY 2024**

It was lovely to see so many people attend the January Parish Council meeting. The PC works very hard for the community so your support and positive feedback was really appreciated. Thank you. <a href="Planning: No planning applications this month.">Planning: No planning applications this month.</a>
<a href="Parish Council's Budget and Precept: This was discussed at great length at the meeting.">Precept: This was discussed at great length at the meeting.</a> We are still none the wiser regarding costs for services from

April 2024. However, we have to set our budget and we have to set our precept now. From April, Norton Parish Council will be funding many services including dog and litter bin - weekly emptying, grit bin filling (twice a year), verge maintenance (twice a year), footpath strimming and maintenance (twice a year). We still have no idea what services will be statutory, but we hope that Highways (potholes, jetting etc) will be included and SC will still provide. We have also agreed with SC to fund some of the maintenance for Minchington Rec, which is owned by Somerset Council. We have agreed to take on the funding for grass cutting, tree and rose maintenance and dog and litter bin emptying (another 4 bins on top of the 8 bins we already own). To give you an example on costs for dog bin emptying from April – a proposed cost is currently looking £7.80 per bin per week. This service alone will cost the Parish Council approximately £4,867 a year. Minchington Rec is a central focal point of the village and very popular with families. Therefore, it is important that it is still maintained to a high level. The Parish Council have now fixed their budget and the precept will be set at £45,000. For a BAND D property this will mean the Parish Council part of your Council Tax will be £137.91 per year. The breakdown of total number of dwellings in each band in the village is: Band A - 7; Band B - 62; Band C - 71; Band D - 43; Band E - 71; Band F -60; Band G - 27; Band H - 3. Total number of properties in the parish: 344.

# **Recent Flooding in Norton sub Hamdon**

Flooding has occurred again at the end of Rectory Lane. One resident said the drain's outfall becomes ineffective once the water level reaches the drain's outfall height. He is asking SC to fit a non-return valve to the pipe. Requests were made regarding the footbridge (on footpath Y20/23) that crosses the brook to be repaired, and for the bridge to be raised to enable flood defences to be bult. The Rights of Way area warden has been notified and has asked the Lead Local Flood Authority to visit the site and deal with this matter. A tree has fallen across the brook between this footbridge and the junction at Great Street and is preventing the clear flow of water. Elsewhere, there are blockages impeding the flow: alongside the footpath (Y20/14) from Little Street towards Chiselborough, including a yellow plastic bag and the fallen tree by the Wessex Water pumping station. The tree has been in the water for

over two years, hindering a smooth flow towards the river on the other side of the A356. If you own property next to a watercourse you are responsible for clearing obstructions, see below.

Riparian Landowner responsibilities: If you own land or property next to a river, stream or ditch you are a 'riparian landowner', and it is assumed you own the land up to the centre of the watercourse. Riparian landowners are responsible for keeping banks clear of any obstruction which increases flooding risk, either on your land or downstream if washed away. You are responsible for maintaining the riverbed and vegetation growing on the banks, and you must remove any litter and animal carcasses, even if they did not come from your land. The next PC meeting will be held on Monday 12th February at 7.30pm in the committee room in the Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend. **REFUGEE AID FROM TAUNTON - HONOUR FOR** 

**RAFT** The Kings Award for Voluntary Service (MBE for charities) was granted to Raft through the Refugee Support Group (RSG), refugeeaidfromraft.org.uk The King's Award was granted in November 2023 for eight years of voluntary work overseas and in their local area. Raft trustees wrote on their Facebook page: 'This belongs to each and every one of our wonderful volunteers, past and present, who have given time, hard work and commitment over eight years'. Those sentiments include all those who have supported Raft through Refugee Support Group, have donated goods, organised and attended fundraising events, and who have printed articles. Nothing would be achieved without such supportive volunteers, and we do hope they will continue to help. Raft continues to request clean, washable clothing in

good condition for men and women (all sizes for both), teenagers, children and babies in refugee camps. This includes waterproofs; winter clothing, especially for men; boots, shoes and trainers, in great need; new underwear for all; hygiene products, especially for women and babies, and toiletries (unwanted Christmas gifts?) for all. Any item is very much welcomed. Raft is always being asked for blankets, sleeping bags and tents and, with so many victims of wars and natural disasters, disability aids are very much needed, e.g. sticks, crutches, walkers, medical supplies. If you have anything you think might be useful to an injured person, please include it. A charity in Cardiff collects from Raft and ships them in a container which Raft helps to fund.
