Construction of a new Garden Room/Home Office in the Southeast corner of the existing main property (Norton House) curtilage. No objections.
Parking in Norton: Once again we have received reports of irresponsible parking in Norton. The areas of concern that have been reported include the bottom of Little Street, the junction of Great St with New Rd (outside the shop) and outside the pub along Great Street. Many of these vehicles are parked in the same place for days without being moved. Please if you have a garage or driveway then use it. Many thanks.
