# PARISH COUNCIL REPORT SEMPTEMBER

**PLANNING**: The Parish Council had one planning application to consult on:

OUTLINE Planning Application Number: 23/02859/OUT

Location: The Stables Land Behind Highwoods

North Street Norton Sub Hamdon

Proposal: Outline Application with some matters reserved except access for the construction of up to 5 dwellings, parking, landscaping, ecology areas and associated works utilising a modified existing highways access

The Parish Council discussed this in detail. They agreed to support this outline planning application but only if the following conditions were met:

Condition - A maximum of 5 dwellings – 2 bungalows and 3 houses. In the last census the population in Norton was 727. With Norton having an older age demographic (Over 34% are aged over 65), there is a shortage of bungalows. Approx.

number of properties in Norton 325 of which approx. 31 are single storey dwellings (= 9.5% are single storey dwellings)

Condition - Plot 5 needs to be a bungalow to avoid any loss of privacy to residents in Highwoods Close PLUS 1 other – suggest plot 1 as this would help with visibility at the entrance to the site.

Condition - To install a pavement giving access to village amenities. This road is dangerous to walk on. The lack of a pedestrian footpath between the proposed development and the village amenities

creates an unacceptable level of risk to pedestrian users along North Street where the national speed limit applies (60mph) and a blind bend in the road which is less than 100ft from the proposed entrance. Condition - An agreement must be in place regarding the continued maintenance of the proposed ecology site after the development has been built.

### **NEW DEFIBRILLATOR FOR OUTSIDE THE**

VILLAGE HALL The Parish Council have managed to secure partial funding for a defibrillator through a government scheme. The government will pay half the cost of the defibrillator and locked cabinet, with the Parish Council paying the other half. The defibrillator will be installed on the outside of the village hall under the CCTV and outdoor light. This will be available to the community 24 hours a day 365 days a year! The village hall committee have very kindly agreed to pay the installation costs and the small amount of electricity that is required to run it. It will be registered with the ambulance service via The Circuit online registration as soon as it has been received and installed – hopefully within a month!

KILL YOUR SPEED! We have received reports of dangerous driving in the village, in particular along Great Street - between The Reading Room café and The Lord Nelson. This is one of the narrowest parts of the village and one of the most dangerous areas for pedestrians, with Pill Bridge on a blind corner. You are not able to see if there is any oncoming traffic. The Parish Council have been in touch with Highways and the Police to raise our concerns. We have been made aware of certain vehicles that seem to be using this area as a racetrack. If you know of a young adult who has maybe recently passed their test or maybe they have just bought their first car, it might be a good idea to sit them down and discuss the need to drop their speed. Excessive speed on both motorbikes and cars through the village is not only putting themselves at risk, but also other motorists and pedestrians at risk of serious injury or death. PLEASE, CUT YOUR SPEED BEFORE A SERIOUS ACCIDENT HAPPENS HERE.

## STREET SIGN REFURBISHMENT PROJECT -

**UPDATE**: I am delighted to be able to tell you that thanks to the generosity of some wonderful residents in Norton (the majority of donators have asked to remain anonymous, so we feel it's best if all names are held), we have managed to raise a total of £795 towards the street sign refurbishment project for the village. The Parish Council feel very lucky to have such incredible support in our parish and they wish me to send a huge 'THANK YOU' to you all. We are also very grateful to the two 'artists' who are carrying out all the restoration work. There is a small shortfall which the Parish Council have agreed to fund. Thank you once again!
